





**Fig 2. Continuous drain current as a function of mounting base temperature.**




**Fig 3. Safe operating area; continuous and peak drain currents as a function of drain-source voltage.**

**Fig 4.** Transient thermal impedance from junction to mounting base as a function of pulse duration.







**Fig 5.** Output characteristics: drain current as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values.





**Fig 6.** Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values.





**Fig 7.** Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of drain current; typical values.





**Fig 8.** Normalized drain-source on-state resistance factor as a function of junction temperature.





**Fig 9. Gate-source threshold voltage as a function of junction temperature.**





**Fig 10. Sub-threshold drain current as a function of gate-source voltage.**





**Fig 11. Forward transconductance as a function of drain current; typical values.**





**Fig 12. Input, output and reverse transfer capacitances as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values.**





**Fig 14.** Gate-source voltage as a function of turn-on gate charge; typical values.





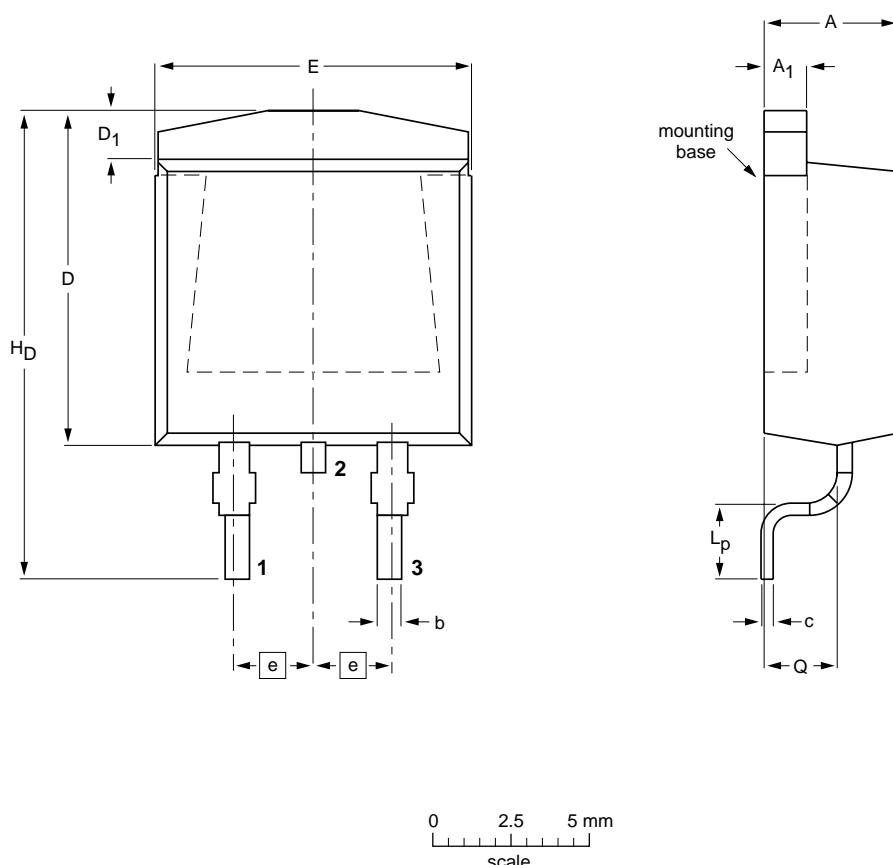


