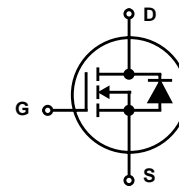

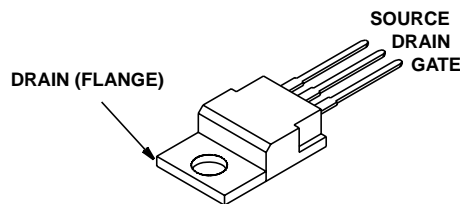

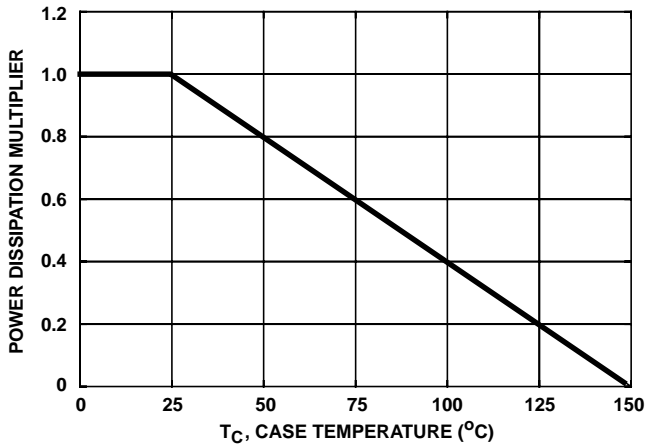


FIGURE 1. NORMALIZED POWER DISSIPATION vs CASE TEMPERATURE

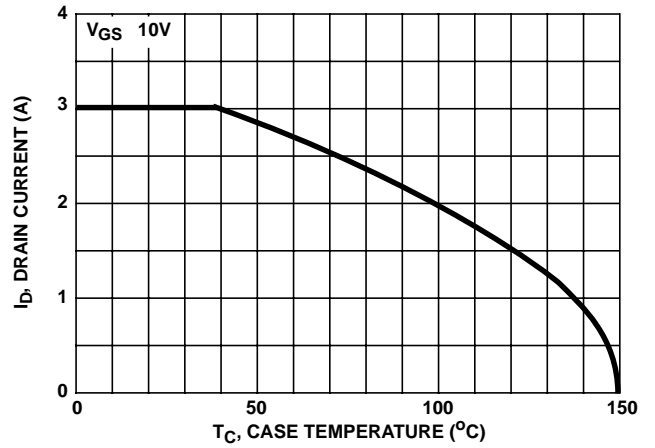


FIGURE 2. MAXIMUM CONTINUOUS DRAIN CURRENT vs CASE TEMPERATURE

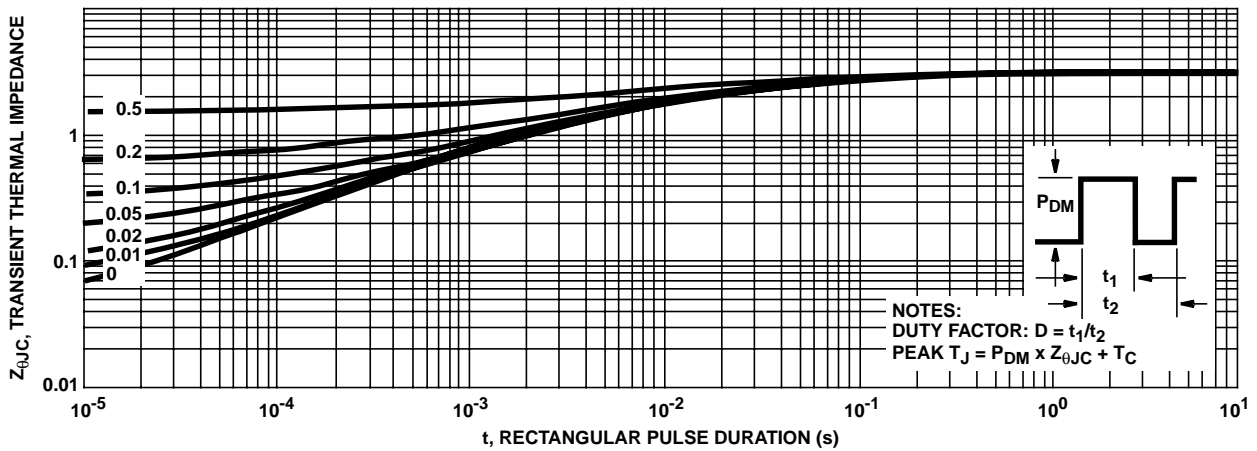


FIGURE 3. MAXIMUM TRANSIENT THERMAL IMPEDANCE

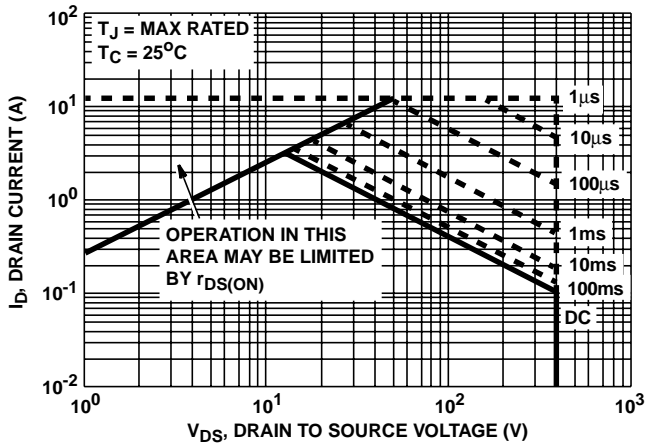


FIGURE 4. FORWARD BIAS SAFE OPERATING AREA

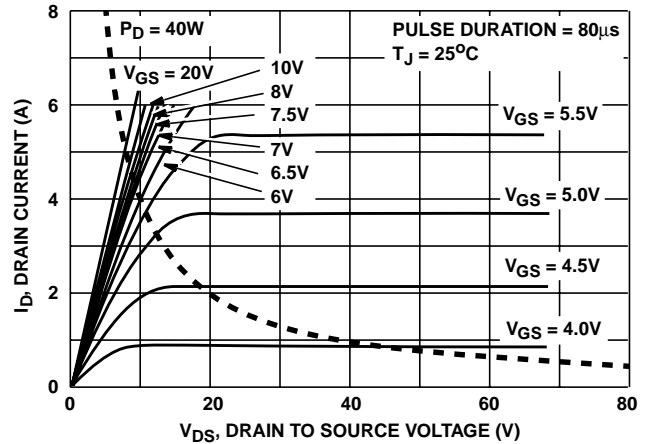


FIGURE 5. OUTPUT CHARACTERISTICS

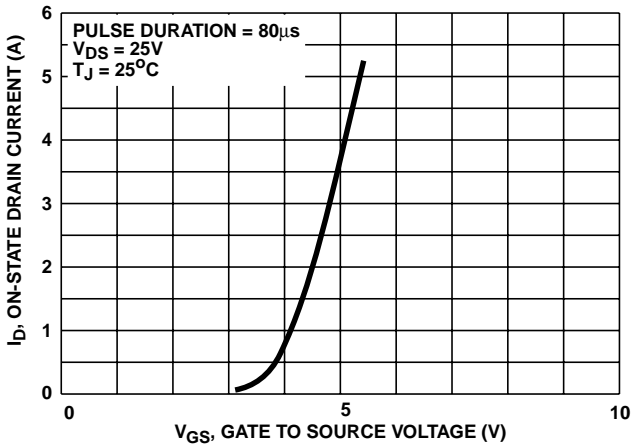


FIGURE 6. TRANSFER CHARACTERISTICS

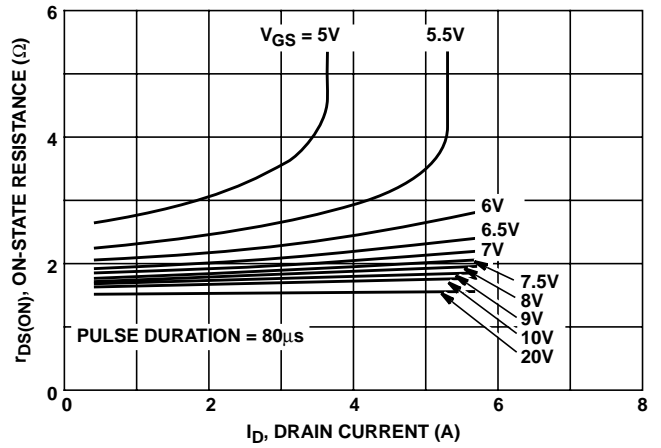


FIGURE 7. DRAIN TO SOURCE ON RESISTANCE vs GATE VOLTAGE AND DRAIN CURRENT

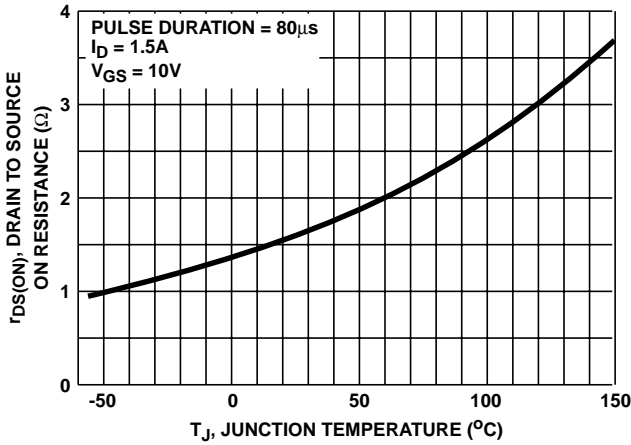


FIGURE 8. DRAIN TO SOURCE ON RESISTANCE vs JUNCTION TEMPERATURE

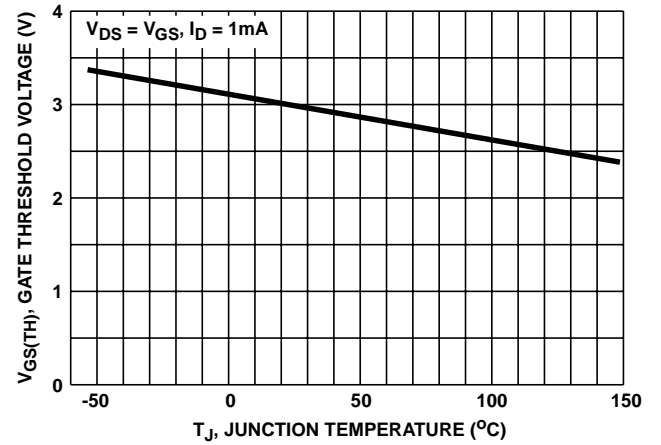


FIGURE 9. GATE THRESHOLD VOLTAGE vs JUNCTION TEMPERATURE

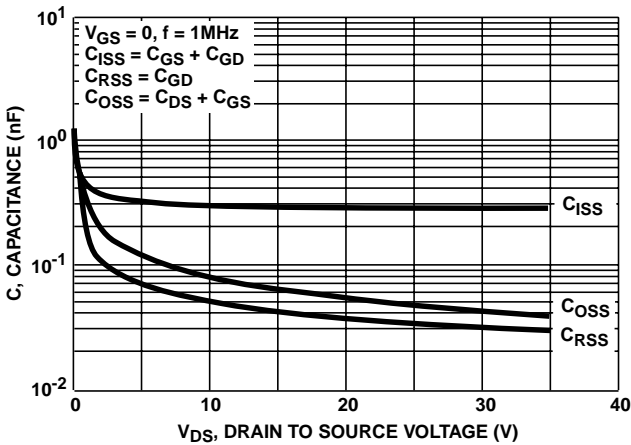


FIGURE 10. CAPACITANCE vs DRAIN TO SOURCE VOLTAGE

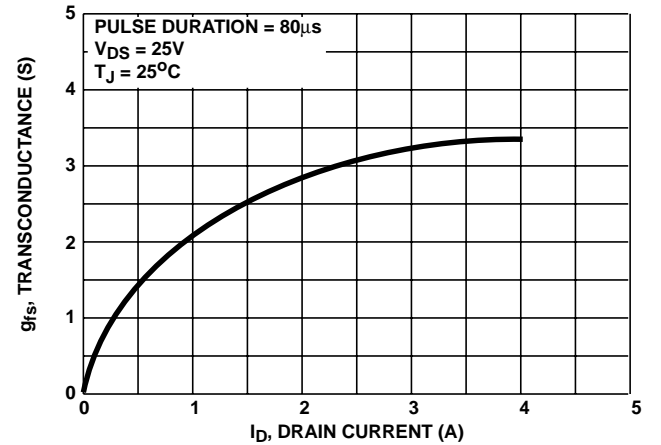


FIGURE 11. TRANSCONDUCTANCE vs DRAIN CURRENT

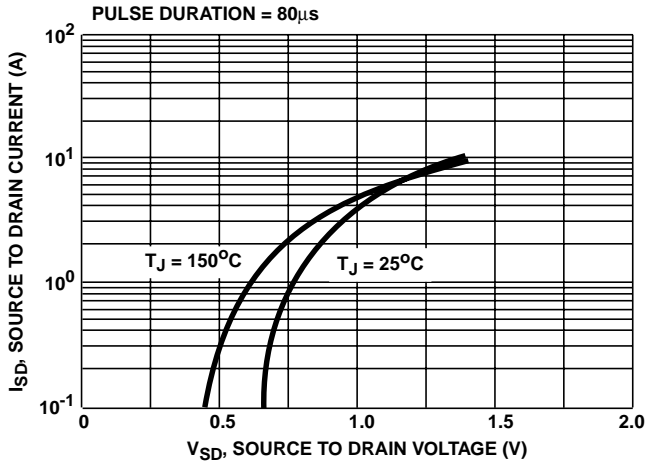


FIGURE 12. SOURCE TO DRAIN DIODE VOLTAGE

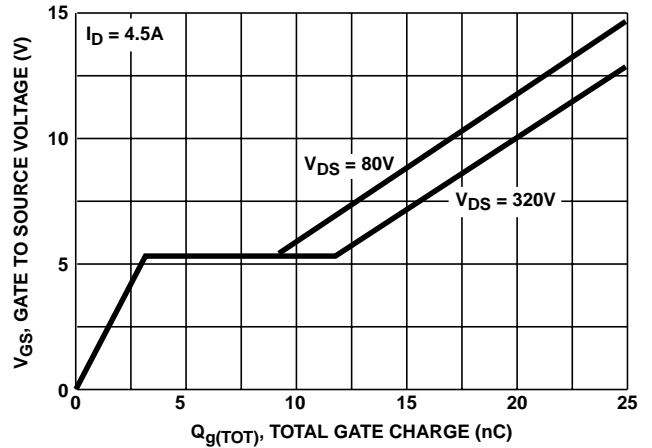


FIGURE 13. GATE TO SOURCE VOLTAGE vs GATE CHARGE

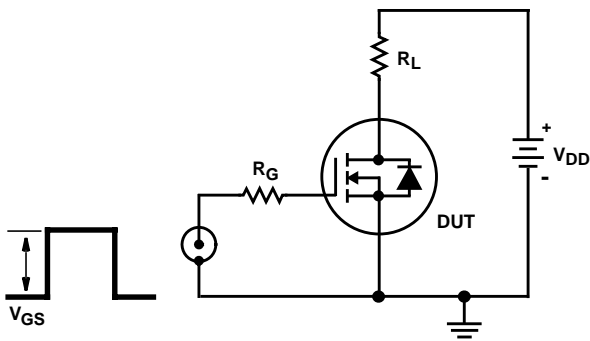


FIGURE 14. SWITCHING TIME TEST CIRCUIT

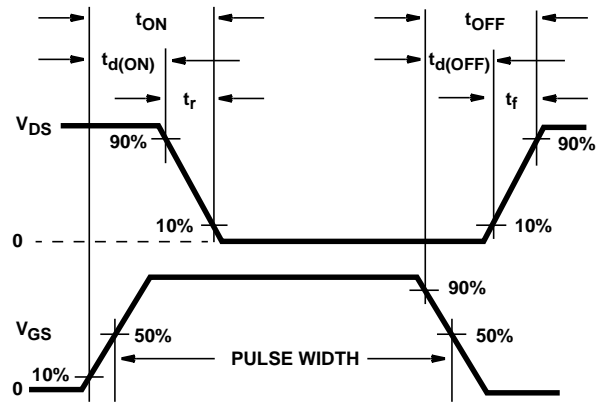


FIGURE 15. RESISTIVE SWITCHING WAVEFORMS

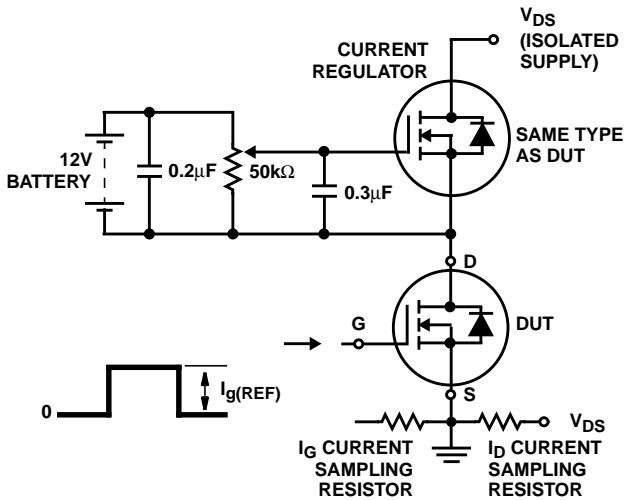


FIGURE 16. GATE CHARGE TEST CIRCUIT

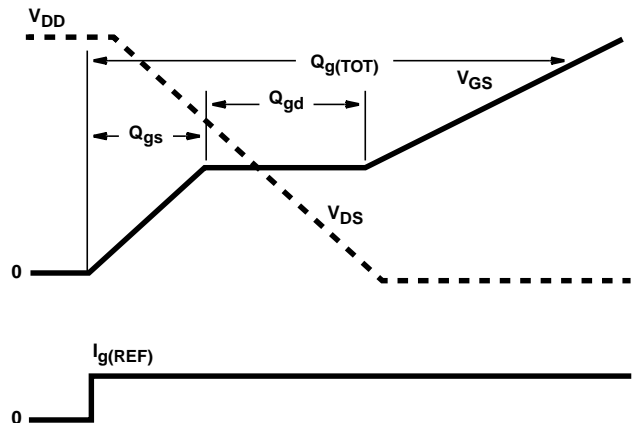


FIGURE 17. GATE CHARGE WAVEFORMS
